American Amusements/Melody Music "Determining Player Averages"

Returning Players that played last year will use their <u>final highest average</u> from the last season, regardless of Division/Night, please refer to "Historical Averages," to start the season (minimum of 3 weeks or more in a division.)

NOTE: For the first 3 weeks of 8Ball (9 games played.)

- A returning player who has an established average from the past year, and is now playing in a <u>higher</u> Division, shall deduct 1 point off their established average.
- If the player has moved up 2 Divisions, they shall deduct 2 points from their established average.
- If a player moves down 1 Division, they shall <u>increase</u> their established average by 1 point.

A **New Player** is a player that is...

- A brand new player to the league.
- A player that did play in the past 2 years.
 - Subject to League Official Review

New Players will use an average as follows...

- Division 1 players Minimum of 7
- Division 2 players Minimum of 7
- Division 3 players Minimum of 7
- 9-Ball players Minimum of 4

On the first night for a <u>New Player</u>, they shall be placed on the team's score sheet with an average of 7 for 8-Ball or a 4 for 9-Ball.

The new player keeps that Divisional minimum average for 9 played games in 8Ball, and 18 games played in 9Ball, after which, the average shown on the current stat sheet will be used going forward.

Note: Once you have established a <u>Divisional League Average</u>, and for the rest of the league season, your average used, will be as published on the weekly stat sheet. You must have played a minimum of 3 weeks in a division to establish your average.



Minimum Games Played to Establish a Divisional Average...

- 8Ball 9 games played
- 9Ball 18 games played

Averages are calculated by total points divided by games played.

0.00 to 1.49 = 1 average

1.50 to 2.49 = 2 average

2.50 to 3.49 = 3 average

3.50 to 4.49 = 4 average

4.50 to 5.49 = 5 average

5.50 to 6.49 = 6 average

6.50 to 7.49 = 7 average

7.50 to 8.49 = 8 average

8.50 to 9.49 = 9 average

9.50 to 10.00 = 10 average
```
